INFORMATION:

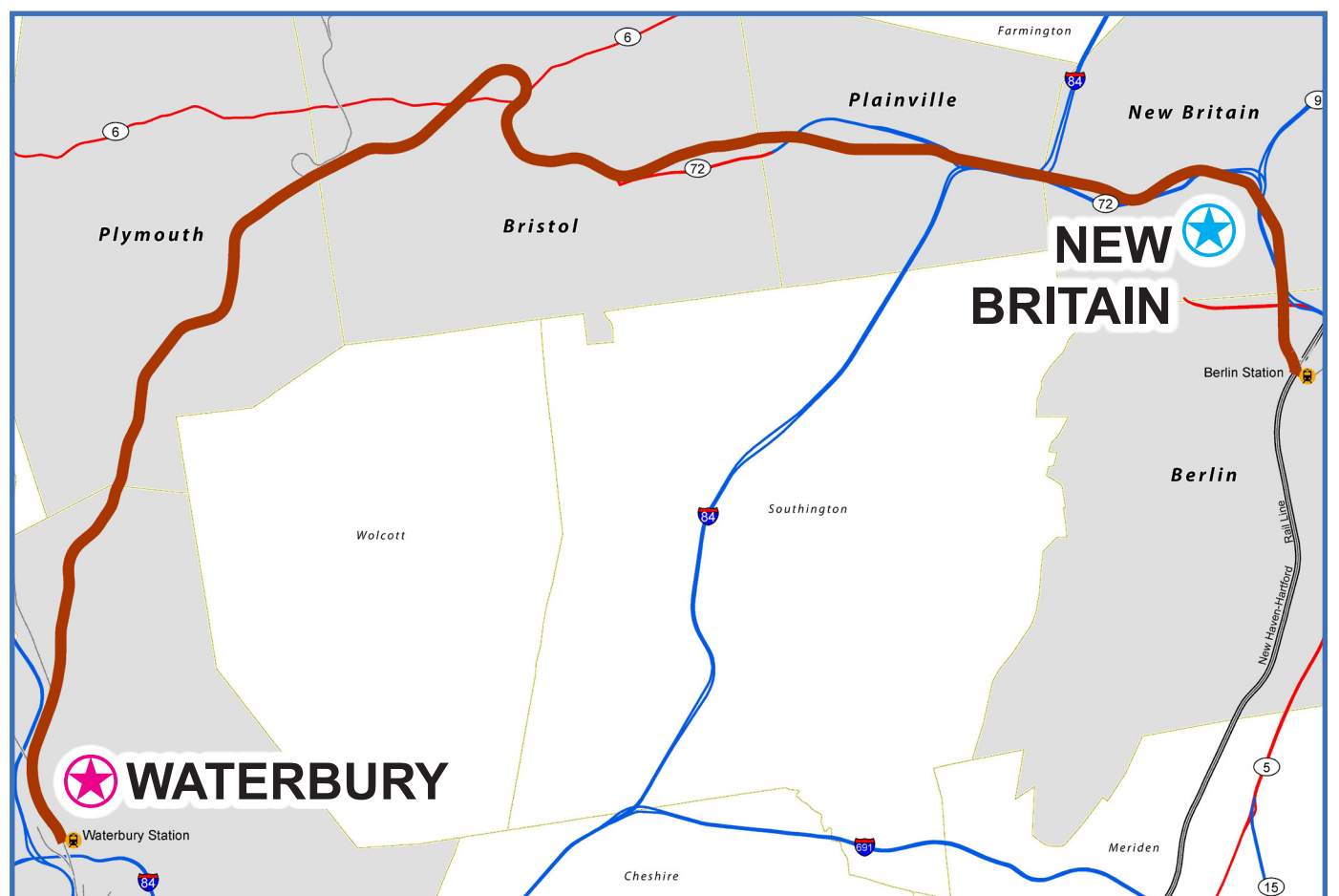
